

- Other conferences will be scheduled as needed



Daily Schedule

Handbook

- Each family will receive a copy of the magnet criteria

- OConferences will be scheduled for any students in danger or being placed on probation/dismissed from BDMA



Magnet Criteria



Students are expected to be present and on time to school daily as well as picked up at the end of the school day on time.

If a student has 10 or more unexcused absences, OR there are 12 or more tardies, OR is picked up later than 2:45 more than three times, in a nineweek grading period, the student could be placed on probation.

Attendance

Students must maintain an E (Exceeds), M (Meets), or P (In Progress) on all kindergarten standards for each nine-week report card and meet high frequency word criteria.

<u>High Frequency Word Quarterly Criteria</u>

If a student is not able to meet academic criteria, the student could be placed on probation.

Kindergarten



Students must maintain grades of A's, B's, or C's on all progress reports and report cards in academic areas (ELA, Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies)

After the first report card, if a student has a grade of an 'F' in any academic area, the student could be placed on probation.

Academics

1st-5th Grade



Students must maintain an M (Meets) or P (In Progress) on all conduct standards for each nine-week report card.

If a student has two major office referrals or two or more N (Needs Improvement) on conduct standards, on any nine-week report card, the student could be placed on probation.

Behavior

Kindergarten



Students must maintain an 'S' in conduct on all report cards.

If a student has two major office referrals or fails to maintain an 'S' in conduct in a nine-week grading period, the student could be placed on probation.
