Britt David Magnet Academy is governed by the rules and regulations of the Muscogee County School District. The Britt David parent and student handbook is not intended to replace the MCSD Behavior Code and Discipline Policy Handbook, but provide information that is unique to Britt David. For information not addressed in this handbook, please refer to the MCSD Behavior Code and Discipline Policy Handbook.

Weekly Communication

Thursday Thoughts is a newsletter emailed and posted to the website every Thursday. This newsletter covers important dates and information of events and activities going on at Britt David. In addition to the weekly school newsletter, each class will communicate through Class Dojo, an app. On Thursdays, folders will be sent home for 1st-5th and daily for Kindergarten to serve as a way to communicate academic progress.

Guidelines to a Positive Parent Visitation to the Classroom

Welcome to our school and your child's classroom. As we encourage parent involvement in our school, please keep in mind that when you are a visitor in the classroom, instruction is taking place and disruptions should be kept to a minimum. All visits are scheduled ahead of time.

Please follow the guidelines below:

- Sign in at the school office before going to the classroom. Be sure to bring a valid ID.
- Turn off cell phones
- Enter quietly and take a seat where designated or in back of the room
- Food and drink are prohibited
- Do not converse with your child or hover near their desk
- Do not involve children in the classroom in conversation. Your presence alone can be a distraction to many children
- If you would like to have a conversation or conference with the teacher, please schedule a separate time to talk with him/her.
- Since this is instructional time, do not involve the teacher in a conversation that takes his or her attention away from the students.
- Please limit your visit to thirty minutes
- Younger children may not accompany parents in the classroom visit

After School Program

The after-school program is operated by Britt David Magnet Academy and run by MCSD teachers and staff. Funds from this benefit the school. Visit the website for more information and to sign up. All students will complete a registration sheet in the event students need to stay on a last minute basis. *Any car riders who are not picked up daily from school by 2:45 can be escorted to the After School Program until their ride comes and parents charged the daily fee. This also includes after school clubs.

Attendance

The school day begins at 7:45 a.m. each day and ends at 2:15 p.m. Students should not arrive to campus prior to 7:00 a.m. as there is no supervision available. The front and back car loops will close at 7:43am each morning. If arriving at 7:43 or later, please park in the front and walk your child inside. If a student has 5 or more absences, OR there are 5 or more tardies, OR is picked up later than 2:45 p.m. more than three times, in a nine-week grading period, the student will be placed on probation. After a certain number of unexcused absences, a hand written note will no longer be accepted and official documentation may be requested by the school.

Tardy Policy- If a student is tardy to school, please park and walk your child to the office. All students not in class by 7:45 are considered tardy. **Withdrawals-** Parents should notify the school office as soon as possible if a student is leaving BDMA. The student's cafeteria account, library account, textbooks, and devices must be assessed before withdrawal can be completed. **Early Checkouts-** Any student who must be checked out of school before the end of the school day, must be signed out in the office by someone listed on the registration form. No student shall be checked out after 1:45 p.m. unless it is a documented emergency or medical appointment. Documentation must be submitted the next day to the front office. Checking out of school to avoid traffic or getting started on an early start to vacation will not be excused.

From the MCSD Handbook- Georgia law requires children between the ages of six and 16 must enroll in a private, public, or homeschool program. Children under age seven are subject to the law after they are enrolled in a Georgia school for 20 days or more. The school district is charged with responsibility for enforcing the Mandatory Attendance Law. The school social worker (listed as visiting teacher in the law) must investigate, monitor, and follow-up with student attendance problems. While the school social worker may be required to file charges in State Court or Juvenile Court for chronic attendance problems, we are primarily

dedicated to working with the family to improve student attendance. Students may be temporarily excused from school in keeping with MCSD Board Policy. [see MCSD Board Policies JB, JBA, JBC, and JBCD]. These provisions also apply to students assigned to attend an alternative public school program established by the Board.

Reduction of Unexcused Absences: The MCSD shall adopt policies and procedures to reduce unexcused absences that shall include but are not limited to the following: 1. The MCSD will notify the parent, guardian, or other person who has control or charge of the student when such student has five (5) unexcused absences. The notice shall outline the penalty and consequences of such absences and that each subsequent absence shall constitute a separate offense. 2. After two (2) reasonable attempts to notify the parent, guardian, or other person who has charge of the student, the school system shall send written notice via first class mail or certified mail with return receipt requested; and 3. MCSD will provide to the parent, guardian, or other person having control or charge of each student enrolled in public school a written summary of possible consequences and penalties for failing to comply with compulsory attendance. 4. By September 1 of each school year or within 30 school days of a student's enrollment in the school system, the parent, guardian, or other person having control or charge of such student shall sign a statement indicating receipt of such written statement of possible consequences and penalties. In addition, students age ten or older by September 1 shall sign a statement indicating receipt of a written statement of possible consequences for noncompliance to the local system's policy.

Birthday Celebrations

Birthday party invitations may be distributed at school only under the following terms:

- Everyone in the homeroom is invited, or all girls or all boys are invited
- If your child is only inviting a few friends, invitations may not be distributed at school.

If your child would like to celebrate his or her birthday at school, you may send in or bring a special treat for your child's class only, to be passed out during lunch. The treats should be ready to serve. Please ask the teacher if there are food allergies or other health issues in the class. If you would like your child's name displayed on the Britt David digital sign in the front of the school for his or her birthday, the cost is \$10.00 and the money goes into our student activity fund. Please see the front office.

Bullying Policy

All families will receive the Code of Conduct which outlines the Bullying Policy in detail. The Muscogee County School Board believes that all students can learn better in a safe school environment. Behavior that infringes on the safety of students will not be tolerated. Bullying, as the term is defined in Georgia law, of a student by another student is strictly prohibited. Such prohibition shall be included in the Handbook and Code of Conduct for all schools within the school system.

Students who experience bullying are encouraged to report and share information with any school district personnel. Students who want to make a report of bullying behavior in writing, may obtain and fill out a "Silent Report" form. These forms are available in the offices of school counselors and school administrative offices.

Bullying behavior is defined as:

- 1. Any willful attempt or threat to inflict injury on another person, when accompanied by an apparent present ability to do so; or
- 2. Any intentional display of force such as would give the victim reason to fear or expect immediate bodily harm; or
- 3. Any intentional written, verbal, or physical act, which a reasonable person would perceive as being intended to threaten, harass, or intimidate, that:
 - Causes another person substantial physical harm within the meaning of Code Section 16-5-23.1 or visible bodily harm as such term is defined in Code Section 16-5-23.1. Visible bodily harm is defined by 16-5-23.1 as bodily harm capable of being perceived by a person other than the victim;
 - Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's education;
 - Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating or threatening educational environment; or
 - Has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.

Chromebooks

All students have been issued a Chromebook and a charger to use during the school day. In an effort to be good stewards of taxpayer dollars, students must be responsible for the care of their Chromebook and not damage it in any way. Chromebooks are to be carried in a case at all times when not in use. Students who damage Chromebooks and/or accessories can be given a replacement fee as per Board (MCSD Board Policy JS: Student Fees, Fines, and Charges). Parents have access to the Go Guardian Parent App to monitor screen usage. Use the Parent Tech Resources under the Families tab.

Clubs and Competitions

There are many opportunities for academic competitions, clubs, and after-school activities. Britt David students participate in and/or try out for a variety of clubs such as: Student Council, Running Club, Bible Club, Science Olympics, Safety Patrol, Helen Ruffin Reading Bowl, Picture Book Bowl, Math Team, School Play, Robotics, Spelling Bee, Photography Club, Drama Kids, and more!

*If a student is not picked up on time from an after-school club or practice, he or she can be removed from the club and/or escorted to the After-School Program until a parent arrives and parents will be charged the daily fee. All club members will pay the ASP registration fee and complete paperwork in the event the student needs to use this after practices.

Communication/Parent Contact

- Teachers will send a weekly email of information
- All staff members have an email address for you to correspond with them.
 When emailing a teacher or staff member, please allow up to 24 hours for a response.
- If you have a concern or question, please correspond with the classroom teacher through phone or email.
- Thursday Thoughts is a digital, weekly newsletter of current topics including celebrations, important information, and dates. It will be emailed and posted to the school website each week.
- Thursday Red Folders- Sent home each week with graded papers, flyers, and other important information from the school or teacher. Please sign, empty, and return the folder each week.
- Social Media- Britt David is very active on Instagram and Facebook. Our PTA also has active pages. Please be sure to follow along!
- -School-wide Mass Communication is another way parents can be notified of important information by telephone, text, or email. Please be sure all phone numbers are up to date and let us know of any changes.

The school telephone is a business phone and may be used by the students only in case of an emergency. After school arrangements should be made before the child leaves home in the morning.

Conferences

Parent conferences may be scheduled in writing, email, or by phone. Teachers keep their own calendar for conferences unless the office sets up a special meeting. Conferences will normally be held before or after school hours. The teachers should not be disrupted during the instructional day.

Dismissal

Please follow the dismissal maps and directions for afternoon car pick up.

Students will be released only to those individuals listed on the registration forms. For the car rider line- we ask that you display your car tag to make for a smooth process. If you forget your car tag, please park and come into the office with your ID for checkout. If you need to change the mode of transportation, please use Dojo or email the teacher. You may want to call the office to make sure the teacher saw the message if you do not get a reply.

Students who have not been picked up by 2:30 will be brought to the front office. After 2:45, students will be escorted to the After School Program and may be charged a daily fee.

Electronic Devices

In accordance with Georgia House Bill 340 and aligned with our focus on safety and academic integrity, we are **limiting the use of personal electronic devices for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade during school hours.** Students must secure their personal phones, earbuds, smartwatches, and other non-school-issued electronic devices, and they are not to be accessed from the time school begins until dismissal, unless explicitly permitted by school administration and teachers for educational purposes or during designated times (e.g., before/after school, lunch, or extra-curricular events). Unauthorized use during instructional time will result in progressive disciplinary action. This change is intended to support greater student engagement and promote a respectful and productive learning environment.

End of the Year Awards

Celebrations of success will be held at the end of the year. The following is a list of our end of the year awards.

Graded Papers

On Thursdays, each teacher will send home a folder that includes graded papers and a snapshot progress report. Please sign the folder log and return the empty folder to school the following day.

Grading System

Progress reports are distributed every four and a half weeks and report cards every nine weeks. These reports follow the guidelines and evaluation ranges set by MCSD.

<u>Kindergarten Grading-</u> GKIDS is a Georgia Report used for kindergarten grading. Kindergarten teachers will communicate expectations and progress.

A conference can be requested by parent or teacher to discuss academic progress.

Lost and Found

It helps tremendously if the student's name is written on outwear, lunchboxes, bookbags, etc. Unclaimed items are placed on the stage in the

Lost and Found area. At the end of each month, all unclaimed items are donated to the MCSD Sara Spano Clothing Bank.

Lunch with your Child

You are more than welcome to have lunch with your child. Seating is available on the stage for visitors and their child. During pleasant weather, the courtyard area is available. Parents must bring a valid ID and sign in through the front office. After signing in, please wear your badge or sticker given to you. If you bring food from a restaurant, please put it in a brown bag available in the office.

Magnet Program

Britt David Magnet Academy is continuing our new magnet journey-Advanced College Preparatory with CTAE Integration. CTAE stands for: Career Technical and Agricultural Education. Each grade level is focusing on Career Clusters specific to that grade level. There are 17 Career Clusters in the state of Georgia. Twice per month students participate in a CTAE Club during the school day to explore that career. We are looking forward to seeing Project Based Learning (PBL) in our classrooms as we incorporate more ways to integrate the CTAE Focus into our lessons. We also have opportunities for perspective families to visit.

Medication/School Clinic

The school clinic is operational from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 10:00 a.m.- 1:00 p.m. on Fridays. The office staff is available at other times.

School Clinic Guidelines:

- Written medical authorization is required before any medication can be given to students.
- Verbal permission is not accepted.
- The medication form may be obtained from the office staff, clinic worker, or website.
- All prescription medication must be in the original container with a clear label.
- Non-prescription medications also require a medical form and must be in original containers.
- Students are not allowed to self-administer medication.
- All medication will be kept in a locked cabinet in the clinic and documentation will be kept.

• Parents will be called and the student must be picked up if him or her are too sick to stay in class.

Please note- withholding health issues about your child from the school could be life threatening and potentially dangerous. It is the responsibility of the parent to notify school authorities about a student's medical condition at time of registration or immediately upon a medical diagnosis.

PTA (Parent Teacher Association)

Britt David is home to one of the hardest working PTA groups in the state. We are very proud of the officers and parent volunteers who spend long hours working to make this school a great place to learn for our boys and girls. A PTA Raffle takes place at the beginning of the school year and the drawing will take place at the Fall Festival. Parents agree to participate in the raffle when they sign the Letter of Commitment at the start of the school year. This is the only PTA Fundraiser of the year. Membership dues are \$10.00 for the year and installation of new officers is held at the last meeting, normally in May.

Parking on Campus

Please park in a designated parking area or spot while on campus. There is no drop off or pick up allowed at the media center gate. Cars are not to be parked (left unattended) in loading zones, at the yellow curb, or on grass at any time. Please do not park anywhere along the front driveway. The curb at the front is reserved for pickup vans and buses.

Picture Days

Picture days occur twice a year. One is within the first nine week of school and the other in early spring. Each time an individual picture package is offered. The fall pictures are also for the yearbook. Class pictures will be taken in the spring. **Students are not required to be in uniform on picture days.**

Safety

Safety on and around our campus is our number one priority. Students and staff participate in several safety drills throughout the year. There is a school safety plan that is reviewed and updated frequently. We ask that everyone do their part when visiting our school- check in with the front office and keep all doors secured at all times. Please notify the office if you see anything out of place or unusual when you are on campus.

School Telephone

The school telephone is a business phone and may be used by the students only in the case of an emergency. After school arrangements should be made prior to the student leaving home in the morning. We will be happy to relay messages to teachers or students, if necessary. Please do not request for a teacher or student to come to the phone as they are not able to leave the classroom to answer the phone unless there is an emergency.

School Nutrition Program (SNP)

(From the SNP Handbook) The school nutrition program provides a healthy breakfast and lunch choice for students every day. Students may bring their own lunches from home as well. Restaurant containers are not allowed in the cafeteria. Parents are encouraged to have lunch with their children and a school lunch may be purchased to eat in the cafeteria with the student.

Students with Special Dietary Needs: MCSD School Nutrition will make meal modifications and substitutions to the regular school meals for a student with a disability that restricts their diet. The Special Dietary Needs Prescription Form **must be** completed and signed by a licensed physician, unless the child has a healthcare plan or an IEP/504 Plan on file, and returned to MCSD School Nutrition Program, including the school cafeteria manager and the Nutrition Specialist before the school cafeteria can provide any modifications or substitutions. A form and instructions can be found on the School Nutrition page of the MCSD web site, or at the school clinic or cafeteria. You may contact the School Nutrition office at 706-748-2386 for more information.

<u>Free and Reduced Meal Applications:</u> A new application must be completed and approved every school year before your child can qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits. For quicker processing, an online application is available at www.myschoolapps.com. If you prefer, a paper application is available upon request at your child's school or at the School Nutrition Office at 2960 Macon Road.

<u>Paying for School Lunch:</u> MCSD SNP does not accept personal checks as payment for meals. Payments may be made by cash, money order,

cashiers check, travelers check, or online via My School Bucks using your debit or credit card.

Elementary Meal Prices

Menus are available on the MCSD website for Britt David. Menus are subject to change due to availability.

Charging Meals: Charging meals is discouraged but may be necessary in certain cases. Elementary students will be allowed to charge a total of three breakfasts and three lunches. If you child has reached his or her charge limit, and does not have money for the account, and does not have cash, an alternative meal will be provided. There is no provision for adults to charge. No charges will be accepted on a la carte items. Students will not be able to charge any meal after May 1st.

State Testing Requirements

Students in kindergarten are assessed using GKIDS (Georgia Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills) Teachers complete assessments with the students and record their progress through an online platform. Reports are shared throughout the year with parents.

Students in 3rd-5th grade take the GMAS (Georgia Milestones Assessment System) This test is in the spring of each school year. Reports will be sent home in the last report card in May. If a student is not performing on grade level, a placement committee can be formed to determine whether the student be retained or promoted based on a review of the overall academic level of the student.

St. Elmo Center for Gifted

Students who are State Identified Gifted will receive gifted services through St. Elmo Center for the Gifted. Students are not responsible for missed work the day they attend St. Elmo. Lunch accounts from Britt David are used at St. Elmo.

Any student who is currently NOT State Identified Gifted, can be referred by a parent or teacher. There is a window of time that the Gifted Testing window is open- 1st-5th the window opens in the Fall and for Kindergarten students, the referral window opens in the Spring. Visit St. Elmo's school website for more information.

Student of the Month

Each month one student is chosen out of each classroom to be the Student of the Month. This student displays the character word for the month on a consistent basis. Teachers choose the student and announce the Student of the Month. A luncheon is held monthly for the student and his or her parent/special friend to bring a lunch and celebrate. If your student is chosen, an invitation will come home along with a yard sign to use for that month.

Testing

There are a number of formal/standardized and informal tests given throughout the year. These are noted in the weekly newsletters, and/or any special notices that are sent home.

Vision/Hearing Screenings

Vision and Hearing screenings are not routinely provided by MCSD. Educational screen specialist will complete vision and hearing screenings for special education students and regular education students using the MTSS Process.

Regular education students who are suspected of having a Vision/Hearing problem **that is affecting classroom performance**, go through the MTSS Process and will be referred as a Tier 1 referral. This will be initiated by their classroom teacher.

Visiting Our School



If a parent/guardian needs to speak to the teacher, please call or email to schedule a conference.

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Parents,

At Britt David Magnet Academy, we believe in fostering a positive learning environment by setting clear expectations for behavior. When students make choices that do not align with these expectations, we respond in a consistent and constructive manner to help them learn and grow.

Behavior Plan/Conduct Grade

- Every 9 weeks, students will receive two conduct grades.
- The first conduct grade will reflect behavior from the first day of the 9 weeks through the progress report date.
- The second conduct grade will reflect behavior from the day after progress reports through the last day of the 9 weeks.
- These two grades will be averaged to determine the student's final conduct grade for the 9 weeks.
- Each time a student receives a Think Sheet, points will be deducted from their conduct grade. 3 points will be deducted for minor infractions, and 4 points will be deducted for moderate infractions. (Attached you will find our behavior flow chart providing examples of minor and major infractions)
- An office referral will result in 10 points being deducted from a student's conduct grade for the 9 weeks.
 - Minor & Moderate Infractions: What to Expect: If your child receives a minor or moderate infraction, the following steps will occur:
- A Think Sheet will be sent home detailing the reason your child received an infraction.
- Please review the sheet with your child, sign it, and return it to school the following day.

Conduct Grade Deductions

To help reinforce the importance of responsible behavior, infractions will result in the following deductions from your child's conduct grade:

- Minor Infraction 3 points deducted
