Guidelines to a Positive Parent Visitation to the Classroom

Welcome to our school and your child's classroom. As we encourage parent involvement in our school, please keep in mind that when you are a visitor in the classroom, instruction is taking place and disruptions should be kept to a minimum. All visits are scheduled ahead of time.

To ensure that your visit is supportive for our learning environment, please follow the guidelines listed below.

- Sign in at the school office before going to the classroom. Be sure to bring a valid ID.
- Turn off cell phones
- Enter quietly and take a seat where designated or in back of the room
- Food and drink are prohibited
- Do not converse with your child or hover near their desk
- Do not involve children in the classroom in conversation. Your presence alone can be a distraction to many children
- If you would like to have a conversation or conference with the teacher, please schedule a separate time to talk with him/her.
- Since this is instructional time, do not involve the teacher in a conversation that takes his or her attention away from the students.
- Please limit your visit to thirty minutes
- Younger children may not accompany parents in the classroom visit

After School Program

The after-school program is operated by Britt David Magnet Academy and run by our own teachers and staff. Funds from this benefit the school. Visit the website for more information and to sign up. *Any car riders who are not picked up daily from school by 2:45 can be escorted to the After School Program until their ride comes and parents charged the daily fee. This also includes after school clubs.

All-Pro Dads

All Pro Dad Chapters provide an opportunity for dads to spend quality time with their children that will strengthen their relationship. A schedule will be sent out for dates for dads or male guardians to meet at McDonald's on Airport Thruway for a special time together.

Attendance

The school day begins at 7:45 a.m. each day and ends at 2:15 p.m. **Students should not arrive to campus prior to 7:00 a.m. as there** is no supervision available.

If a student has 10 or more unexcused absences, OR 12 or more tardies, OR the student is picked up later than 2:45 more than three times, in a nine-week grading period, the student could be placed on probation and possibly dismissed.

<u>Tardy Policy-</u> When a student is tardy, a parent <u>must</u> accompany them to the office to sign-in. Any student who is on school property but not in his or her assigned classroom following the bell, will be considered tardy to school. The last bell rings at 7:45 a.m.; therefore, those students who are not in the building at that time are considered tardy. Students need to be seated by 7:45. Beyond 12 tardies could result in probation.

<u>Withdrawals-</u> Parents should notify the school office as soon as possible if a student is leaving BDMA. Withdrawal papers must be prepared in advance and the students cafeteria account, library account, textbooks, and devices must be assessed before withdrawal can be completed.

Early Checkouts- Any student who must be checked out of school before the end of the school day, must be signed out in the office by someone listed on the registration form. No student shall be checked out after 1:45 p.m. unless it is a documented emergency or medical appointment. Documentation must be submitted the next day to the

front office. Checking out of school to avoid traffic or getting started on an early start to vacation will not be excused.

Reduction of Unexcused Absences: From the MCSD Handbook-The MCSD shall adopt policies and procedures to reduce unexcused absences that shall include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. The MCSD will notify the parent, guardian, or other person who has control or charge of the student when such student has five (5) unexcused absences. The notice shall outline the penalty and consequences of such absences and that each subsequent absence shall constitute a separate offense.
- 2. After two (2) reasonable attempts to notify the parent, guardian, or other person who has charge of the student, the school system shall send written notice via first-class mail or certified mail with return receipt requested; and
- 3. MCSD will provide to the parent, guardian, or other person having control or charge of each student enrolled in public school a written summary of possible consequences and penalties for failing to comply with compulsory attendance.
- 4. By September 1 of each school year or within 30 school days of a student's enrollment in the school system, the parent, guardian, or other person having control or charge of such student shall sign a statement indicating receipt of such written statement of possible consequences and penalties. In addition, students aged ten or older by September 1 shall sign a statement indicating receipt of a written statement of possible consequences for non-compliance to the local system's policy.

*The school social worker shall monitor the daily attendance of students declared "habitually truant."

Birthday Celebrations

Birthday party invitations may be distributed at school only under the following terms:

- Everyone in the homeroom is invited, or all girls or all boys are invited
- If your child is only inviting a few friends, invitations **may not be distributed at school.**

If your child would like to celebrate his or her birthday at school, you may send in or bring a special treat for the class to be passed out during lunch. The treats should be ready to serve. Please ask the teacher if there are food allergies or other health issues in the class.

If you would like your child's name displayed on the Britt David digital sign in the front of the school for his or her birthday, the cost is \$10.00 and the money goes into our student activity fund. Please see the front office.

Book Fairs

Several times during the year, PTA will sponsor book fairs. Children usually bring home flyers advertising some of the books that will be for sale. Each class will shop on specific days.

Chromebooks

All students have been issued a Chromebook (to include Case and Charger) to use during the school day. Students must be responsible for their Chromebook/Case/Charger at all times. In an effort to be good stewards of taxpayer dollars, students must be responsible for the care of their Chromebook and not damage it in any way. Chromebooks are to be carried in a case at all times when not in use. Students who damage Chromebooks and/or accessories can be assessed a replacement fee as per Board (MCSD Board Policy JS: Student Fees, Fines, and Charges).

Bullying Policy

All families will receive a copy of the MCSD Code of Conduct Handbook that outlines the Bullving Policy. From the MCSD Handbook- MCSD does not tolerate bullying. Students who experience bullying are encouraged to report and share information with any school district personnel. In the event you see or hear about bullying, please let someone know as soon as possible. Bullying is defined by Georgia law as follows: (1) Any willful attempt or threat to inflict injury on another person, when accompanied by an apparent present ability to do so; (2) Any intentional display of force such as would give the victim reason to fear or expect immediate bodily harm; or (3) Any intentional written, verbal, or physical act that a reasonable person would perceive as being intended to threaten, harass, or intimidate, that: (A) Causes another person substantial physical harm within the meaning of Code Section 16-5-23.1 or visible bodily harm as such term is defined in Code Section 16-5-23.1; (B) Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's education; (C) Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating or threatening educational environment; or (D) Has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.

For more information please see the MCSD Code of Conduct Handbook.

Each reported incident of bullying behavior will be investigated by the principal/designee and in some cases school security. Consequences will be determined in accordance with our code or conduct and may include one or more of the following:

- suspension from school
- referral to the student discipline tribunal
- assignment to alternate educational programs
- dismissal from Britt David Magnet Academy

Clubs and Competitions

There are many opportunities for academic competitions, clubs, and after-school activities. Britt David students participate in and/or try out for a variety of clubs such as: Student Council, Running Club, Bible Club, Safety Patrol, Helen Ruffin Reading Bowl, Picture Bowl, Math Team, School Play, Robotics, Spelling Bee, Drama Kids, and more!

*If a student is not picked up on time from an after-school club or practice, he or she can be escorted to the After-School Program until a parent arrives and parents will be charged the daily fee.

Communication/Parent Contact

- Each week, teachers will send a weekly email to give details of the Following week
- All staff members have an email address for you to correspond with them. Teacher emails are posted on the website. When emailing a teacher or staff member, please allow up to 24 hours for a response.
- Thursday Thoughts is a digital, weekly newsletter of current topics or interest including celebrations, important information, and dates. It will be emailed and posted to the school website each week.
- -Blackboard Connect is another way parents can be notified of important information by telephone. Please be sure all phone numbers are up to date and let us know of any changes.

The school telephone is a business phone and may be used by the students only in case of an emergency. After school arrangements should be made before the child leaves home in the morning.

Please discuss the following arrangements with your child before school:

- Alternate transportation in the event of bad weather
- Changes in after school child care schedule
- School work and materials/after school plans
- Provisions to pay for lunch, special projects, etc.

Conferences

Parent conferences may be scheduled in writing, email, or by phone. Teachers keep their own calendar for conferences unless the office sets up a special meeting. Conferences will normally be held before or after school hours. The teachers should not be disrupted during the instructional day.

2:15 p.m. Car Riders and After School Program Dismissal

Dismissal

Students will be released only to those individuals listed on the Registration forms. For the car rider line- we ask that you display your car tag to make for a smooth process. Any changes must be made in writing (Signature required) and submitted to the office.

Students who have not been picked up by 2:45 will be escorted to the After School Program. Parents will be notified and may be responsible for the cost of this supervision.

This also includes after school clubs or activities.

Electronic Devices

Elementary students are not permitted to have a cellular phone or other electronic devices, unless for a classroom activity led by the teacher. If it is used for after-school, it must remain turned off in the bookbag.

End of the Year Awards

Celebrations of success will be held at the close of each school year by grade level. The following is a list of our end of the year awards.

Graded Papers

On Thursdays, each teacher will send home a folder that includes graded papers and a snapshot progress report. Please sign the folder log and return the empty folder to school the following day.

Grading System

Progress reports are distributed every four and a half weeks and report cards every nine weeks for K-5. These reports follow the guidelines and evaluation ranges set by MCSD.

Kindergarten- The kindergarten report card is used by teachers in evaluating the ongoing growth and development of their students, as defined by MCSD.

If parents have concerns related to student progress or grading, a conference with the teacher is highly encouraged.

Lost and Found

Unclaimed items are placed in the lost and found area on the stage in the cafeteria. It helps tremendously if the student's name is written on outwear, lunchboxes, bookbags, etc. Please do not allow students to bring electronic devices, games, candy, toys, extra money, etc. (unless they have permission from the teacher). The school will not be responsible for these items, if they become lost.

Magnet Program

Britt David Magnet Academy is embarking on a new magnet focus-Advanced College Preparatory with CTAE Integration. CTAE Stands for: Career Technical and Agricultural Education. We are 'Future Focused' and want to expose all of our students to careers that they could one day explore in the future. We have several ideas and programs that will take place throughout the year to highlight our new magnet focus.

Medication/School Clinic

The school clinic is operational from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 10:00 a.m.- 1:00 p.m. on Fridays. The office staff is available at other times. Written medical authorization is required before any medication can be given to students. Verbal permission is not accepted. The medication form may be obtained from the office staff, clinic worker, or website. All prescription medication must be in the original container with a clear label. Non-prescription medications also require a medical form and must be in original containers. Students are not allowed to self-administer medication. All medication will be kept in a locked cabinet in the clinic and documentation will be kept. Parents will be called and

The student must be picked up if him or her are too sick to stay in class.

Please note- withholding health issues about your child from the school could be life threatening and potentially dangerous. It is the responsibility of the parent to notify school authorities about a student's medical condition at time of registration or immediately upon a medical diagnosis.

PTA (Parent Teacher Association)

Britt David is home to one of the hardest working PTA groups in the state. We are very proud of the officers and parent volunteers who spend long hours working to make this school a great place to learn for our boys and girls. A PTA Raffle takes place at the beginning of the school year and the drawing will take place at the Fall Festival. Parents agree to participate in the raffle when they sign the Letter of Commitment at the start of the school year. This is the only PTA Fundraiser of the year. Membership dues are \$10.00 for the year and installation of new officers is held at the last meeting, normally in May. A schedule of meetings/activities is included in this handbook.

Parking on Campus

Please park in a designated parking area or spot while on campus. There is no drop off or pick up allowed at the media center gate. Cars are not to be parked (left unattended) in loading zones, at the yellow curb, or on grass at any time. Please do not park anywhere along the front driveway. The curbat the front is reserved for pickup vans and buses.

Picture Days

Picture days occur twice a year. One is within the first nine week of school and the other in early spring. Each time an individual picture package is offered. The fall pictures are also for the yearbook. Class pictures will be taken in the spring. **Students are not required to be in uniform on picture days.**

State Testing Requirements (GMAS)

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADES K - 8

Each school principal shall distribute student data from the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) End-of-Grade test, or comparable assessments, to teachers prior to the beginning of each school year. Each teacher shall use data to focus instruction on identified student academic performances in grades K-8.If a student is not performing at grade level, a placement committee will be formed to Determine whether each student shall be retained or promoted based on a review of the overall academic achievement of the student; to develop an accelerated, differentiated, or additional instruction plan for each student who does not achieve at grade level.

Safety

Safety around our campus is our number one priority. Students and staff participate in several safety drills throughout the year to practice what to the in the event of an emergency. There is a school safety plan that is reviewed by a team and updated frequently. We ask that everyone do their part when visiting the school by coming in to the front office to check out your child with an ID, wearing a visitors badge when around campus, and keeping all doors secure and closed at all times. Please notify the front office if you see anything out of place or unusual when you are on campus.

School Nutrition Program (SNP)

(From the SNP Handbook)

The School Nutrition Program provides a healthy breakfast and lunch choice for students every day. Students may bring their own lunches from home. Restaurant containers are not allowed in the cafeteria. Parents are encouraged to have lunch with their children and a school lunch may be purchased to eat in the cafeteria with the students.

Free and Reduced Meal Applications

A new application must completed and approved every school year before your child can qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits. For quicker processing, an online application is available at www.myschoolapps.com. If you prefer, a paper application is available upon request at your child's school or at the School Nutrition Office at 2960 Macon Road.

Paying for School Lunch

Charging Meals

Charging meals is discouraged, but may be necessary in certain cases. Elementary students will be allowed to charge a total of three breakfasts and three lunches. Middle and high school students will be allowed to charge a total of one breakfast and one lunch. If your child reaches his/her charge limit and does not have money in his/her account, and does not have cash with which to purchase their meal, an alternative meal will be provided. There is no provision for adults to charge. No charges will be accepted for a la carte items. Students will not be able to charge any meal after May 1st through the duration of the school year.

Special Dietary Needs

MCSD School Nutrition will make meal modifications and substitutions to the regular school meals for a student with a disability that restricts their diet. The Special Dietary Needs Prescription Form **must be** completed and signed by a licensed physician, unless the child has a healthcare plan or an IEP/504 Plan on file, and returned to MCSD School Nutrition Program, including the school cafeteria manager and the Nutrition Specialist before the school cafeteria can provide any modifications or substitutions. A form and instructions can be found on the School Nutrition page of the MCSD web site, or at the school clinic or cafeteria. You may contact the School Nutrition office at 706-748-2386 for more information.

Lunch with your Child: You are more than welcome to have lunch with your child. Seating is available on the stage. During pleasant weather, the courtyard area is available. Parents must bring a valid ID and sign in through the front office. After signing in, please wear your badge or sticker given to you. If you bring food from a restaurant, please put it in a.different bag if eating in the cafeteria.

School Telephone

The school telephone is a business phone and may be used by the students only in the case of an emergency. After school arrangements should be made prior to the student leaving home in the morning. We will be happy to relay messages to teachers or students, if necessary. Please do not request for a teacher or student to come to the phone as they are not able to leave the classroom to answer the phone unless there is an emergency.

St. Elmo Center for Gifted

Students who are State Identified Gifted will attend St. Elmo one day per week. The schedule is:

Tuesday- 1st, 2nd, and 4th grade

Thursday- 3rd and 5th grade

Students will ride a bus from Britt David to St. Elmo and will return prior the dismissal. Students are not responsible for missed work the day they attend St. Elmo. Lunch accounts from Britt David are used at St. Elmo. The students who stay at Britt David will participate in a normal school day.

Student of the Month

On the first day of each month, the student of the month will be announced for each classroom. The student will take a yard sign home to use and return at the end of the month. The last day of the month the student and one parent/special friend will be invited to come have lunch together. The student is chosen based on displaying traits of the Character Word of the Month.

Testing

There are a number of standardized school tests given throughout the year. These are noted in the weekly newsletters, and any special notices that are sent home.

Vision/Hearing Screenings

Vision and Hearing screenings are not routinely provided by MCSD. Educational screen specialist will complete vision and hearing screenings for special education students and regular education students using the MTSS Process.

Regular education students who are suspected of having a Vision/ Hearing problem **that is affecting classroom performance**, go through the MTSS Process and will be referred as a Tier 1 referral. This will be initiated by their classroom teacher.

Visiting Our School

We love for parents to be involved with your child's education. All visitors must set up a time and date ahead of time and keep all visits to 30 minutes or less. Please enter through the front doors of the school, sign in at the office with a valid ID, and wear a visitor name badge. If you are volunteering, please arrange with the teacher and we understand the schedule may be different. If a parent/guardian needs to speak to the teacher, please call or email to schedule a conference.

Parents may escort children to the classroom the first two days of school.



Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

PBIS is an evidence-based, data-driven framework proven to reduce disciplinary incidents, increase a school's sense of safety and support improved academic outcomes." (GaDOE)

Britt David Magnet Academy PBIS Mission Statement: The purpose of the Britt David Magnet Academy PBIS Program is to promote a safe, responsible, and considerate environment.

PBIS Rewards App

Each student has an account with the PBIS Rewards App. Parents are also able to join and see their child's progress. Students are able to spend their points in the store through the use of the App with points the student has earned.


PBIS Points System

Each student will have a daily goal of the number of points he or she can earn. Parents will be notified of any instances where points were not earned. Students will earn points in all classes based on our B.A.R.R.K. expectations (Bulldogs are Respectful, Responsible, and Kind)

PBIS Incentives and Celebrations

At the end of each nine weeks, any student who has an 'S' in Conduct and no major office referrals, will be invited to the PBIS Celebration.

A PBIS cart is available for students to spend their points. This includes small snacks, trinkets, school supplies, etc. Students may also choose to save points for larger items.

Uniform Policy/Dress Code

Monday-Thursday

Tops: solid black, white, or red collared- long or short sleeve only. BDMA logo or monogram are acceptable on collared shirts.
